At the appointed time.



Despite the growing turmoil in our world, there is still one last great outpouring of mercy before the end time (Matthew 24:14; Acts 2:17). This supernatural season is not something we should beg God for. No, God's arrival has been predetermined. It is the Lord's "appointed time."

A "pointed" or "fixed" time is an open demonstration of God's sovereignty and power, whether to call a person or to call a nation. In it we discover with absolute certainty that nothing is impossible for God. It is a season in which God fulfills the hopes and dreams of His people. It is a time in which He has chosen to manifest Hos presence for a specific purpose to accomplish His GOOD & WISE will.

As it is written,

"But you, O LORD, abide forever, and your name for all generations. You will rise up and have compassion on Zion, for it is *time* to have mercy on her, for the appointed time has come." Psalms 102: 12- 13).

On the "appointed time," the Lord rose physically and moved with unfailing compassion on behalf of His people. The appointed time is the moment when divine promises, dreams and spiritual hopes are fulfilled. Remember: Abraham and Sarah had waited in faith for a quarter of a century for God's promise. Finally, as they approached the hundred years of age, the Lord said to Abraham, "At the appointed time I will return to you… and Sarah will have a son" (Genesis 18:14). A year later, "at the appointed time" (Genesis 21:2), Isaac was born to elderly parents!

While there are, in fact, appointed times for judgment (Mark 13:33), this phrase most often represents a time, pre-established by God, **when He Invades humanity** with "prodigies, long-formed plans, [that unfold] with perfect faithfulness." (Isaiah 25:1). Hallelujah!

Demons can face the Lord; nations can line up to fight Yet, "He who sits in the heavens laughs" (Ps. 2: 4). For He makes all things His servants (Ps. 119:91), even plans for the evil of His enemies to be reversed and made to serve God's purpose (Genesis 50:20; Romans 8:28; Acts 2:22-24).

Whether God gave you a vision, a spiritual hope, or a dream for His future, there will be a appointed time when what God spoke happens. This is how the Lord assures us: "Record the vision and write it on boards, so that whoever reads it can run. Because the vision has still reached the appointed time. He rushes to the goal and will not fail. Even if he delays, wait for him, for he will surely come, he will not delay" (Hab. 2:2-3). Even if your vision, hope or dream is delayed, wait. For it will certainly happen at the appointed time.

For, "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit, and your fruit remains" (John 15:16).

The disciples certainly felt that they had chosen Christ. Yet the deeper truth was that God chose them before the foundation of the world. He also chose and predestined us to come to Christ (Ephesians 1:3-5). We could not even come to Christ if the Father had not drawn us (John 6:44). However, he who chose us also appointed us to bear fruit. The same power that worked in us our dedication and faith continues to work in our hearts, naming us to bear fruit. You think God has chosen you? Then also believe that He has appointed you to bear fruit.

#### **Wisconsin Annual Conference Report 2024**



On the agenda was the approval of the Implications Committee whose purpose is to investigate and review any additions to the annual budget of more than \$10,000,

This was followed by a report of Statistic committee. It was reported that there are 387 churches in our conference with an average of 14,000 weekly attendance of 38,680 registered laity.

Also, 240 churches of the 387 churches had paid their apportionments in full.

The financial department of the conference is working with Church Mutual Insurance on obtaining new insurance coverage for some of the churches that have been declared uninsurable,

They have bids out with other insurance companies to help those that would not be covered.

They recommend that when our premiums are due to only pay a monthly only till this process is finished.

The report on the General Conference, which was a postponement of the 2020 conference had 3 items approved.

- To form a regionalism formation instead of a state-by-state jurisdiction,
- Removal of all harmful language from our Book of Discipline
- Revised Social Principles.

Bishop Jung presented the state of church, in which it was approved that the Wisconsin Conference will go from 5 District Superintendents to 4. That divides the state into equal quadrants.

Bishop Jung has reached the end of his 12th year as our bishop and a new bishop will be assigned in September. At that time, being one of the smaller conferences in the Midwest Wisconsin will be sharing a bishop that will include all of Wisconsin and Part of Northern Illinois. We will still hold our own Annual conference separate from Illinois.

The Conferences annual budget was presented with a reduction from 6.3 million to 5.7 million.

The reduction was due to reducing the number of DS and using the bishop from Northern Illinois.

With this reduction our apportionments should be reduced by about 3%.


